

Students: This Responsible Use Agreement (RUA) will guide you in use of the technology and network resources at school. By signing the Emergency Release Card each year, you acknowledge your responsibilities as described in this document.

Parents/Guardians: This document provides an explanation of the different computer and Internet-based resources your child will have access to at school. Your signature on the school's Emergency Release Card each year signifies your acknowledgement of your rights and responsibilities as described in this document.

Benefits of use/access of District electronic resources

Many resources are available through use of the computers in your school or by accessing the District's electronic resources remotely. Here are just some of the things you can do with them:

- Take quizzes/tests to show your teacher what you've learned.
- Access online resources such as the school library catalog, encyclopedias, magazines, newspapers, and more.
- Access career and college information.
- Create, share, and store electronic documents.
- Check your grade status with your teachers.
- Use student-safe communication and collaboration tools like email, discussions boards, etc.

Potential risks

You need to be aware that there are risks when using computers and Internet-based resources. The District has safeguards in place to protect users accessing electronic resources from school sites, but there are always potential risks, including:

- exposure to inappropriate material
- harassment
- negative encounters with others

The following rules will help you avoid these potential dangers while using the great resources that computers provide in your school.

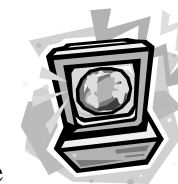
Student rules for computer & Internet use at school or when using District electronic resources/access any time

- I will use computers at my school and District electronics resources/access only for educational goals, objectives, and activities.
- I will never use a computer or District electronic resources/access for any activity that is illegal, against the school's code of conduct, disruptive, or unethical.
- I will never swear, use vulgarities, or inappropriate language while communicating electronically.
- I will not intentionally damage the computers, data, or other technology.
- I will not send or receive unauthorized encrypted or encoded messages or files.
- While at school, I will not eat or drink near computers or other technology equipment.
- I will not share my passwords for any school programs with anyone, including friends.

- I will not use anyone else's password.
- I will not give out personal information about other people or myself on the Internet. Personal information includes my name, pictures, address, telephone number, school address, work address, etc.
- I will not attempt to gain unauthorized access to any District computer device, system, or network.
- I will not attempt to bypass the district's network safety and security systems.
- I will never agree to get together with someone I "meet" online without parental permission and guidance.
- I will not respond to any messages that are mean or in any way make me feel uncomfortable. If I receive a message like this, I will tell my teacher right away, and I will not share it with other students.
- I will respect my privilege of using the school and District's electronic resources/access and will not engage in any use to harm, harass, hurt, or bully other students or school personnel.
- I will respect my privilege of using my own electronic devices while at school by using them only when authorized by the staff member supervising the class or learning area and by following all rules cited herein when granted such use.
- I will cite my source whenever using information, pictures, or music that I did not create. If I will display beyond my classroom, I will get permission from the source, as well.
- I will not engage in peer-to-peer file sharing of files for which I do not have copyright privileges.

Consequences of inappropriate use

In today's society, computers are an important part of life and work. They are also an important part of your learning



experience. However, if you violate the rules outlined in this document, you will face disciplinary action which may include revoking (taking away) your privileges for using school computers and electronic resources/access, your ability to use your own electronic devices while at school, or even expulsion.

Information for Parents/Guardians

We take every precaution possible to comply with the Children’s Internet Protection Act (CIPA) and to ensure your child’s safety while using these educational tools. Please help us teach your child appropriate use of technology by discussing the information in this document and encouraging them to adhere to the rules at all times. If you or your child have any questions or concerns, please contact his/her teacher.

Home Use of the Internet for Learning

Parent involvement and supervision are critical to ensuring your child’s safety on the Internet. The Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified School District assists you in this by providing home access to resources that support your child’s learning. The following are a few examples of the resources available at home as well as school:

- Online Library Catalog: Search for books in the school library by reading level or topic. Print a list to take to school the next day.
- Research tools: Students can research a topic using safe, educational resources provided by the District, and access online encyclopedias, magazines, newspapers, and other reference works. These resources also provide links to external websites that have been reviewed for educational appropriateness.
- Aeries Portal Account: Students in grades 7-12 and their parents will have secure log in to view attendance and class progress using the Aeries Parent/Student Portal.
- School Web Site: Your school’s web site provides direct access to the aforementioned resources and class web pages where teachers can post additional resources selected to support your child’s learning. 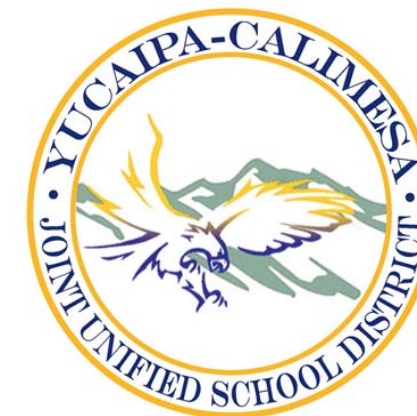

Vandalism/Disciplinary Action Statements

***Vandalism:** Vandalism is defined as any malicious attempt to harm or destroy electronic hardware or software. This includes, but is not limited to: defacing equipment; uploading or creating computer viruses; destruction of data of another user and/or any other agencies or systems that are connected to the network. Any vandalism will result in the loss of computer services, disciplinary action,* and legal referral.

***Disciplinary Action:** Being granted access to online services is a privilege and there are consequences for not exercising responsible behavior in the use of digital equipment and services. According to Board Policy 6163.4, students who do not adhere to the user obligations and responsibilities as outlined in the *Student Responsible Use Agreement for Computer & Internet Use* shall be subject to revocation of the user privilege and disciplinary action. For the first time offense, the user account is revoked until a meeting takes place with the student, his/her parent, and a representative of the District. On the basis of the level of the offense, the user privilege may be revoked for the remainder of the semester or 30 days (whichever is more) and may be revoked for the next semester. In addition to revoking the user privilege, disciplinary action will result. Such action will be in accordance with procedures at the specific school site regarding messages indicating or suggesting pornography, unethical and/or illegal solicitation, racism, sexism, inappropriate language, and any other inappropriate use of technology. Vandalism, as defined in BP/AR 5131.5 – Students: Vandalism, shall result in revocation of user privilege, disciplinary action, and legal action as appropriate. Students are subject to all of the laws and regulations of the United States and are subject to legal action as appropriate.
